### **Course Specifics:**

This course is 8 weeks in length for 3 units of credit.

### **If you will be participating for graded Credit:**

Students who enroll in a course for credit are required to complete all readings and assignments, and they will have a final grade recorded on their University transcript.

This course is transferrable to all undergraduate and graduate degrees at Hope International University and likely to transfer to other accredited Bible colleges.
