ICS5203 Introduction to World Religions

This course provides an overview of major world religions with particular attention to how they compare and interact with Christianity. It examines the origins and development of major world religions and their adaptation to present day social and political situations.

If you will be participating for graded Credit:

This SALT course will consist of lectures with PowerPoint, online discussions, readings, written assignments, and extensive learning resources. A minimum of 15 hours per week including class time and course work is required for those seeking to earn college credit. Students who enroll in a course for credit are required to complete all readings and assignments, and they will have a final grade recorded on their University transcript.

This course is transferrable to all undergraduate and graduate degrees at Hope International University and likely to transfer to other accredited Bible colleges.
