BIG IDEA

Because Jesus sees the unseen, we are called to see, love, and bring hope to those the world overlooks.



ICE BREAKER

Have you ever felt unseen or overlooked? What happened, and how did it affect you? What does it mean to be a destiny changer? Thinking of these two points: Wallace said “we are vessels in the hand of God” Mary said “God is on the move He is changing lives”



MAIN POINTS

- Jesus came not just for the seen, but for the unseen, the overlooked, the marginalized
- “The poor” is more than financial—it includes those crushed by life, spiritually needy, and socially invisible
- Throughout Scripture, the unseen have always been close to the center of God’s heart
- Jesus identifies Himself with the “least of these”—how we respond to them matters deeply
- Poverty is not just lack of money, but lack of opportunity, dignity, and the ability to flourish as an image bearer of God
- We are called not only to notice the unseen, but to actively bring hope and help break cycles of poverty
- God invites us into both local and global impact



DISCUSS

1. What stood out to you most from this week’s message?
2. When have you personally felt unseen? How does it impact you to know Jesus sees you?
3. How does Jesus’ definition of “the poor” challenge or expand your perspective?
4. Why do you think God places such a strong emphasis on caring for the unseen?
5. In Matthew 25, Jesus connects Himself to those in need—how does that change the way you respond?
6. What impacted you most about the stories and partnership with Missions of Hope International?



NEXT STEP

This week, take one intentional step toward the unseen:

- Ask: “Holy Spirit, help me see who I might be overlooking.”
- Pay attention to someone in your daily life who may feel invisible
- Take a step: start a conversation, meet a need, or simply acknowledge them
- Pray about your role in supporting what God is doing locally and globally
