



The Trinity is the clearest picture of God’s love and an invitation into His family.



BIG IDEA

The Trinity reveals that God has always existed in perfect relationship as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is relational at His core, overflowing with love, pursuing humanity, and inviting us into His family.



ICE BREAKER

1. What is the hardest riddle or brain teaser you’ve ever tried to solve?
2. When you hear the word “Trinity,” what comes to mind?
3. Why do you think relationships can sometimes become difficult even between people who love each other?



MAIN POINTS

God has always existed in relationship – Jesus reveals in John 17 that before creation, the Father already loved the Son. Before anything existed, there was already perfect love within God Himself.

The Trinity is seen throughout Scripture – From Genesis 1:26 (“Let us make mankind in our image”) to Jesus’ baptism in Matthew 3, we see the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit working together.

God’s love comes before performance – At Jesus’ baptism, the Father declared His love and approval over Jesus before Jesus performed miracles or began ministry.

The Holy Spirit reminds us we belong – Romans 8 teaches that through the Spirit we are adopted into God’s family and can call God “Abba, Father.”

The Trinity is the blueprint for relationships – Jesus prayed in John 17 that believers would experience the same unity and self-giving love shared within the Trinity.

Christianity is an invitation into God’s family – Through Jesus, we are welcomed into relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, not because we earned it, but because God loves us.

2. Why is it important that God’s love comes before our performance?
3. How does understanding the Trinity change the way you view God?
4. In what ways can our relationships better reflect self-giving love?
5. What does it mean to you personally that God is pursuing relationship with you?

Spend time this week reflecting on the love and relationship within the Trinity.
